Mission Statement

We also encourage more families to get involved in the areas including altar servers, ushers, cross-bearers, fundraiser committees, and other parish and PSR functions.

Introduction

As members of the Lord's Body here on earth, all of us play an important role in the faith formation of our children. While the primary responsibility is in the hands of the parents, the Parish School of Religion program is here to assist you in every way possible to ensure that your children have every opportunity to grow to a mature faith in God, and an understanding of our Catholic faith.

The purpose of this handbook is to inform parents and students about the basic rules and policies of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish School of Religion so that we can work together. Although the basic policies and procedures are listed, please note that it is impossible to include everything that might occur. Other important communications will come home with your child as needed during the year.

PSR Overview

We know that children learn by example and the home is the first and most important classroom for children. It is there that they learn what it means to be a Christian. The PSR program is support for what you do as a parent. The church relies on you to set an example of Christ and His Church, by regular attendance at Sunday Mass as well as reception of the sacraments. Throughout the year we have special programs for the children, and parents are encouraged and welcome to attend. There will be some meetings that are mandatory so please check your calendar.

This Parish School of Religion (PSR) handbook has been compiled to meet the needs of the families of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and other Catholic Parishes whose children attend public schools. It outlines everything from PSR Registration through the Study of the Sacraments. We encourage your participation in all aspects of the program and need your help and support in making the program a success for the youth of the parish.

We are fortunate to have dedicated catechists who have developed and sustained the faith of the church from pre-school through adult classes. An open line of communication between parents and the PSR staff will aide our teachers in providing the best faith-filled learning environment for the children. We want you to be fully aware of your responsibilities and obligations as we collaborate together in the task of proclaiming God's Goodness to your children.

We hope this handbook will answer all your questions. If you have additional questions, concerns or suggestions please call the Religious Education Office.

Extracurricular Activities & the PSR Class Schedule

Religious education and faith formation are necessary components of the overall education of a Catholic child who attends public school. The St. Elizabeth Ann Seton School of Religion, therefore, does not, in any way, consider PSR classes to be "extracurricular" for the children in our program, but instead an essential part of their entire elementary-level education and life experience.

We recognize and respect extracurricular activities, such as sports programs, as important to the physical and social development of your child. We understand that public schools may not consider religious education class schedules when scheduling extracurricular events.

As Catholics, loving God with our whole selves and placing God first is a definitive and essential element of our Catholic Christian identity.

Catholicism is a comprehensive way of life. We ask parents to partner with us to communicate this truth to their child and to reflect it when setting priorities for Monday evenings.

PSR Times & Location

All PSR Classes take place on Monday evenings from September through May and follow the Columbia Local Schools calendar. Any Monday that the schools are not in session for a planned holiday or closed due to bad weather, PSR classes will be cancelled.

Grades 1 through 7 meet in classrooms at Columbia Middle School from 6:30 until 7:45 pm.

The 8th Grade Confirmation class meets from 6:40 to 7:55 pm at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church.

On occasion the group will gather as a whole at SEAS for a Mass or special event. The 2nd Grade First Communion class and 8th Grade Confirmation class have additional meeting times and obligations. Refer to the PSR calendar provided in your child's folder for details.

Parental Involvement

Parent volunteers are always needed in various areas of our Religious Education and Youth Ministry Programs. If you are interested in becoming a catechist, substitute catechist, classroom aide or hall monitor, please contact the Religious Education Office or meet with Ann Wadsworth during PSR. All adult volunteers are required by the Diocese of Cleveland to complete the VIRTUS Program (Protecting God's Children) and have current fingerprinting and background check on file in the Religious Education Office at no cost to volunteers.

As parents, you are the primary teachers of your children, and family faith formation is essential for spiritual growth. Participation in Mass and PSR sessions is also an important part of your child's on-going faith development. Please make an effort to attend regularly. It is also important to take time each week to review with your child any materials that are sent home. Materials may include: important memos and newsletters. This is a great way to reinforce concepts covered in class and stay informed as parents. In the event that your child is absent from a scheduled class, please ask the catechist for lessons missed so that they can be completed at home.

Student Involvement

Students benefit greatly by actively participating in weekly Mass, scheduled PSR sessions, Children's Liturgy of the Word, parish social events and service projects. Each child is blessed with special gifts and should be encouraged to share them with the Parish Community.

All students are expected to be courteous and respectful toward teachers and other students at all times. Each catechist will set behavioral guidelines for his or her classroom which students will be expected to follow. Parents will be notified

of any behavioral problems that cannot be resolved in the classroom. Students are also expected to respect the property of Columbia Middle School and SEAS.

Admission Requirements

1. The PSR program of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church expects families to be active parishioners by being registered members of a Catholic church, attend Mass weekly, and participate in parish activities.
2. Acceptance of students from other parishes requires a letter from the Pastor stating your family is properly registered and active at that parish.
3. Upon initial registration into the program, you must supply a copy of Baptismal and First Communion Certificates (if applicable), even if the sacraments were received at SEAS. If your child has been baptized in another denomination, please contact the Religious Education Office.
4. Students are expected to be in a PSR program from Grade 1 through Grade 8 to ensure they are properly prepared for Confirmation in 8th Grade. Call the Religious Education Office if you have missed any years of education.
5. Registration at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton PSR program implies agreement with and support of all school rules and policies.

Registration and Tuition

Registration begins in April before the end of the PSR year. Completed registration forms and tuition fees are due on July 1. A late fee will apply to registrations received after July 1 and again after August 1 due to the increased expense of reordering and shipping textbooks and materials. An exception is made for families who are new to the parish.

Annual tuition fees are based on projected costs per student and are used to pay for:

- Religion textbooks
- Religious audio-visual materials
- Paper and craft supplies
- Duplicating materials
- Rental of the classrooms
- Miscellaneous student materials and activities

Providing quality programs requires financial support from our families. We are sensitive to families who are experiencing financial difficulties. Please contact Father Charlie (236-5095) or Ann Wadsworth (236-3711) for consultation.

Scholarships

SEAS Religious Education Committee offers Education Scholarships every year. They are available in April and good towards PSR tuition. Each applicant must fill out a scholarship application and write an essay. Watch the bulletin for more details.

Special Concerns and Needs

Parents who have children with physical disabilities, learning disabilities, chronic illness, food allergies, medical conditions, or any special medication – please notify the PSR Office and add details on the registration form. Your privacy is important to us and all related information is kept in strict confidence.

Home schooling

We offer the PSR program to help parents carry out the responsibility of educating their children in the practice of faith. However, some parents may choose to home school their children in religion. SEAS will guide and support families who choose this path. The parish's Home School Policy requires families to purchase and use the PSR text books and meet with the Director of Religious Education four times each year. If you choose to do home schooling it needs to be set-up with the DRE before the start of PSR.

Religious Textbooks

Each fully registered child receives a textbook for their personal use throughout the year. Students making up for a missed grade level are required to purchase an additional text for the missed year to get caught up. If your child loses the textbook, please contact the PSR office to inquire if additional texts are available for purchase. We will do what we can to accommodate your needs.

Phone

We are not able to receive phone calls at the Middle School. If you have an emergency and need to reach your child or the PSR staff, please come up to the school or church.

Safety and Emergencies

While in our care, your child's safety is our primary concern. Please be sure we know everything we need to know about your child, including physical, emotional and medical conditions and concerns before PSR begins. Help us ensure the safety of EVERY child by adhering to the safety guidelines outlined below.

In the case of an emergency at the school, we will first contact parents at the home phone and cell phone numbers provided on the registration form. If neither parent or guardian can be reached we will try the emergency contacts listed on the registration form. If any of your contact information changes throughout the year please inform the Religious Education Office.

Drop-off, Pick-up and Parking

There have been several near misses in the driveway and parking lot of the Middle School over the years. We thank the Lord nothing has happened to our precious youth. With this in mind, we urge you to abide by the following guidelines:

1. **Grades 1 and 2 must be escorted to and from class by an adult or older responsible sibling.** Adults are asked to park in the Middle School lot and NOT in the driveway when escorting children to class.
2. Grades 3 through 7 may be dropped-off and picked-up on the sidewalk leading to the front door. DO NOT allow your child to walk or run through the parking lot or between stopped cars on the turnaround.
3. Carpooling families must complete the Transportation Permission Form at the beginning of the year or for a last minute situation, a signed and dated note granting permission for your child to go home with a friend or neighbor is required.
4. Cars CANNOT be left unattended in the turnaround at any time; IT'S THE LAW and would create a serious problem in the case of a fire.
5. Idling cars stopped in the turnaround MUST form in a SINGLE FILE line to allow moving cars to travel out of the turnaround.
6. Keep your child at your side when walking through the parking lot. No running or horseplay, please.

Drop-off begins at 6:15. Pick-up begins at 7:45. If an emergency arises and you will be late picking-up, contact the Religious Education office before PSR starts. For the safety of all the children adults are not permitted to enter the hallway until classes are dismissed or with express permission by the Religious Education staff. Parents are asked to remain in the lobby of the Middle School until 7:45 when class is dismissed so classes are not disturbed.

Early Dismissal from Class

Please provide a written notice to the teacher before class requesting permission for the child to leave early. The note must be signed by the parent/guardian giving the reason for leaving early from class. Students will be sent to the lobby at the appointed time where the parent can pick up the child.

Policy

We know that children learn by example. The home is the first and most important classroom for the child. It is here that they learn what it means to be a Christian. The PSR program is merely a support for what you do as a parent. We rely on you to set an example as the teachers of Christ and His Church, by regular attendance at Sunday Mass as well as reception of the sacraments. At times during the year we have special programs for the children, and parents are encouraged to attend.

We wish to take this opportunity to commend those parents who bring their children to Mass each Sunday. Sunday Mass is an essential part of our Catholic Faith. Many of our children do not have the opportunity to receive the Eucharist except when we celebrate with them. The family that celebrates Mass together gives a powerful message of faith to their children. Parents should encourage their children to be cross bearers or altar servers to better participate at Mass.

Attendance

Due to the limited teaching time, the amount of material to cover and the necessity of maintaining continuity of teaching, regular attendance is necessary. Diocesan policy dictates children attend a minimum of 80% of classes in order to advance to the next level. Reasonable exceptions can be discussed with the Religious Education Office. If your child is not feeling well, please use your best judgment and determine if your child should be attending class. We do not want to encourage the spread of illnesses at PSR.

Class Arrival

It is very important that students be on time, in class, and ready to begin the lesson at the designated starting time.

Absence from Class

Parents are asked to call the Religious Education Office in advance if the child will be absent. Please leave a message stating the child's name, grade, date and reason for the absence and the day will be marked as an excused absence. Any missed work or assignments should be completed at home before the next class. We realize there are times that advance notice may not be possible, we still ask that you leave a message even if the Religious Education Office is closed. Any absence not called in will be counted as unexcused, so please call.

Long-term Absence from Class

If a student is going to be absent from class for a long period of time the parent/guardian is required to call the Religious Education office to coordinate make-up work for completion at home. Your child's teacher will contact you to discuss lessons and activities missed.

Cancellation of Class

PSR classes follow the Columbia Local School calendar: Any Monday that the schools are not in session for a planned holiday or due to bad weather, PSR classes will be cancelled.

If class needs to be cancelled and Columbia Schools are in session:

1. Channels 3, 5 & 8 will be notified of the closing.
2. Columbia Grade School and Middle School will be notified of the closing.
3. The PSR teachers will be notified, and they in turn will notify the parents of the children not in Columbia Schools.

Rules and Discipline

General rules for PSR are as follows:

1. Students will conduct themselves in a courteous and respectful manner with adults and fellow students at all times. All are expected to follow the Golden Rule of treating others as they would like to be treated.
2. Students are expected to follow standard classroom etiquette. For example, raising a hand to answer questions, following directions and paying attention to the teachers.
3. Food and drinks, chewing gum, candy, toys, and video games are not permitted. Cell phones cannot be turned on or used during class time.
4. Students are to wait in the hallway until a teacher, substitute teacher, or staff member is also in the room.
5. For the safety of everyone concerned, there is to be no running in the halls or around the classroom. Students are to sit on the chairs and not on top of the desks.
6. Students are not allowed in their school lockers during PSR time.
7. COME PREPARED WITH PEN OR PENCIL, BOOK, AND FOLDER.
8. No child is permitted to leave school grounds on foot. (i.e. walking to the library or a ball field). Children must be picked up at the school.
9. Any assignments are to be returned by due date.
10. Students will follow the rules of behavior for the classroom and follow the direction given by the teachers.
11. We are visitors at the school and everyone must be respectful of school property.
12. No soccer shoes or shoes with rollers are permitted.

Disobedience will result in removal from the classroom. The child will be sent to the school lobby to wait with PSR staff until a parent arrives.

Students will remain in the classroom for the duration of class time. Lavatory trips will be limited to emergencies only. Even though halls are supervised throughout class sessions, we discourage children leaving the classrooms.

Radios, CD players, handheld electronic games, etc., are not permitted in PSR. If they are brought to class, they will be taken away and returned to the parents.

The PSR program is firmly committed to providing a safe and respectful learning environment for everyone. We respect the personal dignity of each individual, and personal property. We are visitors in the building and all property is to be treated with great care and caution. The materials in or on desks or lockers are considered private property and must not be disturbed. Please stay away from teacher's desks!

Everyone enjoys humor, but not when it is at the expense of another. Answers given in class should be sincere and well thought out. Students are expected to accept responsibility for their behavior and respond to authority with honesty and integrity.

Disruptive Behavior

PSR runs approximately 24 to 28 weeks with only an hour and fifteen minutes of class time. Disruptive behavior affects everyone and cannot be tolerated. Listed below are the steps that will be taken in case of a discipline problem in the classroom.

1. First offense - The teacher will handle the situation in the classroom.
2. Second offense - The teacher will notify DRE.
3. Third offense -Parent(s)/Guardian(s) will be called to pick up their child from PSR and must attend a meeting with their child and the DRE.
4. Subsequent offenses - arrangements will be made to home school or a parent/guardian will attend class with the child.

Scope and Sequence by Grade Level

GRADE 1:

Grade 1 focuses on the theme of the Holy Trinity. The children are taught that God, our Creator & Father made each person special. They learn that Jesus, the Son of God, is our friend and brother, and that He is human—just as we are. They also learn that the Holy Spirit is our strength, peace, and joy.

The children begin to understand that they belong to the Church community of Jesus' followers and participate in the Church through the sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist. The teacher also lays the groundwork for the study of morality. The children learn that they are responsible to love and care for all God's gifts of creation.

GRADE 2 – Reconciliation and First Holy Communion:

In grade 2 the emphasis shifts to the study of the sacraments as the children review Baptism and prepare for Reconciliation and Eucharist. Their understanding of the Trinity grows as they see God presented as a loving father who forgives them, Jesus as one who gives the gift of Himself, and the Holy Spirit as one who calls us to serve others.

The study of morality continues as the children learn the notion of sin and its effects. The Gospel stories help to show the children their responsibility to care for others as Jesus did. The concept of Church as a community expands as the children learn that the Catholic Church is the Christian community to which they belong.

GRADE 3:

The Church is the focus of study in grade 3. The students learn the traditions of the Catholic Church and some of the beliefs held by Catholics. Knowledge of God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit grow through a study of the Apostles Creed, not just as a prayer, but as a belief to be understood. All seven sacraments are studied and there is an exploration of a variety of ministries within the Church.

The investigation of morality at this grade level includes studying the Ten Commandments, Jesus' Commandment to love, and the corporal works of mercy as guides to live by.

GRADE 4:

In grade 4, the students focus on a study of morality. This is accomplished through an extension of the materials learned in grade 3 as well as a study of the Beatitudes.

The students see God as merciful and always ready to forgive. They see Jesus as the example of Christian life and love. And they look at the Holy Spirit as our helper and our guide in times of temptation.

The sacrament emphasized is Reconciliation and the content deals with our call to be healed. Finally the students study the Church as light and servant to the world.

GRADE 5:

Grade 5 centers on a study of all seven sacraments, which are presented as sacred signs as well as celebrations. The persons of the Trinity are presented as they relate to the sacraments. Students learn that God gave us the ultimate sacrament in Jesus—a visible sign of God’s love. They also learn that love continues through us to the world in the Spirit of God.

The Church is also seen as a sacrament—the sign to the world of the love of God for God’s people. People are seen as the best sign of God’s presence, and all creation is seen as reflecting God’s existence. The fifth graders’ understanding of morality is strengthened as they learn what it means to live as faithful followers of Jesus.

GRADE 6:

The Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) are the basis for grade 6. Students learn that it is in the study of the Hebrew Scriptures that we find the roots of our faith. God taught as the Creator who cares deeply for people and interacts in their lives. Jesus is seen as the fulfillment of the Hebrew Scriptures—the one who brings a new covenant and who proclaims the coming of the kingdom of God. A study of morality is woven throughout. It is seen as the relationship of God and the people that can grow stronger or weaker.

The concept of Church is taught as a continuation of the kingdom of God. The seven sacraments and their celebration symbols are also traced through the Hebrew Scriptures.

GRADE 7:

The 7th grade is now more connected with 8th grade. Confirmation has become a 2-year program starting in 7th grade. They begin to learn about confirmation so they are better prepared for when they make their confirmation in 8th grade.

GRADE 8 - Confirmation

This is a time for the young adults to deepen their relationship with God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. They will learn how to use the gifts of the Holy Spirit. In return they will receive the fruits of the Holy Spirit in their everyday life in making moral decisions, values, personhood, and how to make better choices in their life.

Sacraments

Baptism is a requirement for entering the PSR program.

In the second year of religious education (usually grade 2) the children are prepared for the reception of the sacraments of **Reconciliation and Eucharist**.

When the children are in 8th grade they make their **Confirmation**. The sacrament of Confirmation is open to grades 8-12. Your child is required to have been in 7th grade PSR in order to make their Confirmation. If you have any questions, please call the Religious Education office.

First Communion

Our First Holy Communion program is a two-year program. Students are required to attend first grade PSR, first grade home schooling or first grade in a Catholic school. If your child has not made their First Holy Communion by the second grade, please call the Religious Education office.

First Holy Communion takes place the first Saturday in May. Girls should wear a nice white dress and dress shoes. A veil or flowers can be worn on their head (this is not a requirement). Boys should wear a dress shirt, tie, dress pants, and dress shoes. A jacket can be worn (this is not a requirement). Blue jeans, tennis shoes, makeup and finger nail polish are not permitted. Parents need to be in attendance at the sacraments.

Several times during the year parents/guardians are required to attend certain events with their child/children. These dates will be in the bulletin.

Confirmation Requirements

1. The first meeting is **mandatory** for both parent and student.
2. The student must attend all classes and be mindful of all-important dates.
3. If the student misses a class, they will be required to make up all class work.
4. Requirements and paperwork:
 - a) Rite of Enrollment
 - b) Copy of Baptism and Holy Eucharist Certificate.
 - c) Sponsor certificate (from their parish)
 - d) Confirmation information sheet
 - e) 20 hours of community and parish service (4 service projects)
 - f) Saint report must be turned in 7th grade.
 - g) Spirit Day is mandatory.
 - h) All parents are required to sign up as facilitators for group discussions 3 or more times (depending on class size).
 - i) An interview will be held with the student to make sure they are ready to receive the sacrament
 - j) **All** paperwork must be turned in promptly. You will be given dates as to when they are due.
 - k) Parents must have sponsor name and address by first meeting.

Responsibility of Confirmation Students and Parents

1. The student needs to be prepared for class. Bring binders and completed homework to every class.
2. The student must know the following:
 - a. The Apostles Creed
 - b. The Ten Commandments
 - c. The Holy Days of Obligation

- d. The Beatitudes
 - e. The Spiritual & Corporal Works of Mercy
 - f. The Seven Capital Sins
 - g. The Six Precepts of the church
3. You are required to call if unable to attend scheduled class (except for snow days).
 4. Excuses will be granted for illness or death in the family.
 5. Unexcused absences will result in assignments to be complete before Confirmation.
 6. Confirmation practice is very important and Parent/Sponsor attendance is required.
